When to Visit the Sahara Desert

You can visit the Sahara year-round, but each season offers different experiences.

Spring (March to May): This is one of the best times to visit because the weather is pleasant, with daytime temperatures ranging from 20°C to 30°C. Nights are cooler, perfect for stargazing, and the desert's oases bloom with greenery.

Summer (June to August): The summer is extremely hot, reaching 45°C during the day. Many tours stop running due to the heat, but the desert is much quieter if you can handle the weather.

Autumn (September to November): The temperatures in autumn are milder, ranging from 25°C to 28°C during the day and cooler at night (15°C). It's a quieter time to visit, as most tourists return home after the summer.

Winter (December to February): Daytime temperatures are still comfortable (13°C to 20°C), but it gets cold at night, sometimes dropping to 5°C. Sitting around a campfire under the stars with a warm cup of mint tea makes winter in the desert a magical experience.
